THE SEASON OF LENT

LENT prepares for Easter, for the Evangelization: Formation in Lenten Liturgy disposes both the faithful and Catechumens celebrate THE PASCHAL MYSTERY as the centre of the Liturgical year and of the Christian life.

Lent was originally the time of preparation for those who were to become members of the Church at Easter (the Catechumens).

Flowers are not used and musical remember: **instruments** are only used to support the singing. The Gloria is omitted except on Solemnities and Feasts other than Sunday.

TODAY is traditionally known as Sunday Laetare (=Rejoice Sunday) as we are now more than half way through our Lenten journey to Easter.

LENTEN REFLECTION

"God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved."

Here, then, are **Primary 4's** thoughts on FORGIVENESS.
